Welcome to the U.S. Fire Administration's National Fire Academy's *Interpersonal Dynamics in Fire Service Organizations* course! Participants begin with a critical self-assessment of their individual managerial strengths and weaknesses, which results in a specific plan for their own professional and personal development. Techniques for creating effective organizational environments are defined. Human resource development subjects are researched.

Course modules include: Managerial Style; Stress Management; Conflict Resolution; Time Management; Counseling; Communications; Group Dynamics; and Cultural Diversity.

End-of-class graduation ceremonies are an important part of the course and you are expected to attend. Please do not make any travel arrangements to leave campus until after you and your classmates graduate.
